



**Address of the Pro Grand Master**  
**M.W.Bro. Raymond J. Smith**  
**Annual Assembly of Royal Ark Mariner**  
**Tuesday, 12 December 2017**

Brethren, it is a great pleasure to welcome you all to this Annual Assembly of Royal Ark Mariner. To have so many members present today indicates that support for this delightful Order in our Masonry is as strong as ever.

My first duty, however, must be to bring you fraternal good wishes from our Most Worshipful Grand Master. His duties keep him as busy as ever but he is always aware of our proceedings, indeed his interest remains unabated and during next year he has agreed to be with us on several important occasions. We are indeed most fortunate to have him as our Most Worshipful Grand Master.

This annual meeting of our Order is important, but to those 159 Brethren who have received appointments to Royal Ark Mariner Grand Rank, most of whom have been invested today, it marks a most significant milestone in their Masonic life. They have shown their dedication to Masonry in general, and to this Royal Ark Mariner degree in particular, having succeeded in extending their Masonic knowledge so successfully to have warranted their appointment to Grand Rank in this Order. Congratulations to all of you and it has indeed been my great pleasure and privilege to have invested you today.

All of you who have received preferment should rightly be proud of your achievement and both here, in this Grand Assembly, and in your Provinces and Lodges, your appointment to this high office will rightly be recognised. I hope, however, that having achieved such high office your dedication will not diminish but that you will continue with your commitment to this Order and will encourage others to follow in your footsteps.

Whilst most administrative developments are reported at the meetings of Mark Grand Lodge it is a long period between the meeting in September and the following one in March; too long a period for nothing of importance to have happened.

Our Grand Secretary and the dedicated team of staff that we are most fortunate to have at Mark Masons' Hall, have made great progress with new developments. We see this today with the advance information provided to all of us attending this meeting, in respect of seating, dining and general advice on where to leave regalia and, most importantly, which bars in the Grand Connaught Rooms serve beer and which don't! That development is but the tip of the iceberg in respect of progress.

The Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons' website build is progressing well. The roll-out will take place in the first quarter of 2018. I had a preview last week and it will be a very impressive aid to all the Orders administered from 86 St James's. We are most grateful to V.W.Bro. Bill Divall and Bro. Julian Trought, for the time they are spending on this project.

Our commitment to progressively introduce enhancements to the Keystone Online database continues. Last week phase two was released which sees installation returns go online, thus further reducing the amount of paper that flows from the Provinces and Districts into Mark Masons' Hall.

The Grand Secretary has now completed his planned changes to the structure administering all the Orders at Mark Masons' Hall, the last part of which will bring about a much shorter lead time to all our year books and other publications.

Our busy Grand Secretary and the team are working with Provincial and District Grand Masters to establish a working party charged with shaping a coherent recruitment and retention strategy which will enable us to share best practice throughout the Order. Brethren, I am certain you will be pleased to know that all the Orders are showing a net increase in membership which places us in a strong position for 2018. Grounds for optimism and confidence, but not complacency.

The Mark Benevolent Fund partnership with St John Ambulance is progressing well. The first three vehicles have been handed over, the most recent being in Cumberland and Westmorland on 3 December. On 17 December, North & East Yorkshire will receive their vehicle, a lovely Christmas present for the team there; and Durham is scheduled to receive its vehicle early in the New Year.

From the proceeds of the very successful parks walk back in the spring, applications from those teams for blood bikes are being assessed and we hope to announce shortly which areas will receive funding.

Both are here today and I hope are settling in well in their new office and in congratulating them we also thank the retiring Provincial Grand Masters who have rendered great service to our Order.
